Letter From the Chair

In your lifetime there are bench marks that make you realize how time has gone by so quickly. Now that we have reached 15 years of hosting Randi's Race, it makes me think how far we have come in raising the awareness of domestic violence and helping children.

Perhaps the best place to start is to share the beginning of how Randi's Race was started. Two long years after the murder of my daughter, I experienced this epiphany that told me that I had another journey in taking this horrific tragedy and placing it into something positive.

January 2005 was when it all began. I was serving on the Cumberland County Commission for Women and discussing issues that impact women in our county. I called my fellow commissioner, Deb Donahue, Director of the Domestic Violence Services of Cumberland and Perry Counties (DVSCP) at that time and asked her what I could do to help victims of domestic violence in my community. Within a matter of 9 weeks, we coordinated the first Randi's Race: A 5K Run/Walk for Hope and Courage held on May 7, 2005. We raised over \$14,000. This was a sign of the great gift of hope for me, one which took all my pain and placed it into something where I could keep the legacy of Randi in many hearts.

Since 2005 Randi's Race has been an annual event. The number of people attending has grown, and the amount of funds raised has supported DVSCP programs and now Randi's House of Angels programs. Participants come from the counties of Cumberland, York, Lebanon, Dauphin, and Perry and also from surrounding states like New Jersey and Maryland.

These benchmarks have helped to build the capacity of Randi's House of Angels and allowed us to reach more children. Randi's Race allows me to think back when I struggled, fearing that I would forget Randi. Now it is a reminder of how many children I have helped. Thank you for all your support.

Since its inception fourteen years ago, Randi's Race is responsible for raising more than \$423,000! Registration opens at 8:00 am and the race will kick off at 9:00 am. Randi's Race is a FUN event for the entire family - we offer a kids' race just before 9:00, arts and crafts and plenty of fun! Just after the race, we present ribbons to the top racers in each male/female age group, distribute awards to the top three fundraising teams, and offer terrific door prizes donated by local businesses. Pre-registration deadline is May 3rd, but participants may also register at the race. Please join us to honor Randi and hear from dynamic speakers as we continue to advance efforts to combat domestic violence.

THE GIFT OF LOVE - A Mother's Story

My husband Chris and I knew that I could not have children, but we wanted to have a family. So we made a decision to adopt. And we wanted to make our home a place where we could help children who were left behind, ones placed in the foster care system. As importantly, we wanted to adopt a sibling group, bringing children who already had someone to relate to and to feel safe with, into our home. So, at the early age of 24, I became the mother of two young boys.

First, we brought in two brothers, Niko and Robie. Later came their sister Lisi, who had been in foster care. The three had been subjected to domestic violence and were later part of the foster care system for some time.

Being the mother of three children can be challenging at times. Over the last thirteen years, we have dealt with multiple hospitalizations for mental health issues and multiple appointments stemming from the effects of trauma at such an early age. At times it was difficult.

Then a friend at church shared a flyer about a camp for children of domestic violence, and that is how I became aware of Randi's Camp for Hope and Courage. In 2011 the boys attended their first camp. Robie came each year until he reached thirteen years

old. Later Lisi joined him and will attend this year.

Randi's Camp has helped my children in so many ways. Foremost, being with other campers allowed them to realize that they are not alone, that there were others like them who had experienced domestic violence. Additionally, the camp has given my children something to look forward to each summer, a place where they could meet with highly trained staff who could help them cope, and a place where they could make crafts, play games and eat good food. Each of my children has made friends at camp, and each has grown by learning how to express their emotions.

Randi's House of Angels pays for everything. There is no cost for parents. Additionally, Randi's House provided me a gas card, which made it so much easier to get my children to camp.

When my husband and I became parents, we were committed to providing a safe home and to helping our children to become productive members of society, breaking the cycle of domestic violence. We are so appreciative of all that Randi's House of Angels has done to make that more of a reality.
